



Music Scholarships for Young Musicians

Thomas's Foundation is pleased to offer music scholarships for young musicians who demonstrate significant musical potential and commitment, but for whom financial constraints create a barrier to ongoing study.

The scheme award guarantees funding for up to 4 years for:

- Sustained high quality instrumental tuition delivered by the Tri-borough Music Hub at a Tri Borough Hub music centre;
- Participation in a music ensemble (if applicable);
- Access to resources including instrument (if required), sheet music and exam fees;
- Performance opportunities; and
- A named mentor who liaises between the scholar and family, the music hub and Thomas's Foundation.

Eligibility Criteria

- The cost of ongoing tuition and instrument hire is prohibitive for the family.
- The child is a student in Years 3- 6, attending a school in RB Kensington and Chelsea or LB Hammersmith and Fulham.
- The child demonstrates particular musical talent and clear commitment to their own musical development.
- The child's parent/carer commits to actively support the child in all aspects of the scholarship programme. This includes ensuring regular practice, weekly attendance at lessons and ensembles and making a £10.00 enrolment contribution per year.

Nomination Process

Our open nomination process invites head teachers, music coordinators, instrumental teachers and other music education professionals to nominate students for a scholarship. If short-listed, children and their parents/carers will be expected to attend an audition.
